 Happy New Year, and thanks from all of us for being involved in PAC, our school, and in your child's education. We are so very appreciative of parents/guardians who volunteer and make a difference.

VP Update

- Since Darryl's departure at the Winter break, we have been cobbling together admin support via retired admin Curtis Schreiber (2-3 days a week) and his time has ended as he's off for a much-deserved vacation
- We will find out about our permanent replacement VP soon, but this person won't be starting until after Spring Break
- O Ryan Ward (currently VP at Black Mountain Elem) will be coming in for these three weeks to tide us over with admin support, starting tomorrow (Tuesday)

• Truth and Reconciliation Work at GESS

- We currently have a committee of 10 staff who are learning together and supporting our school's Truth and Reconciliation journey at GESS
- Days like Red Dress Day, National Indigenous Peoples Day, Orange Shirt Day, etc. are our focus, and we're trying to build a team to design learning experiences for the student body
- o In June, we are working to plan learning/speakers/artists/dancers etc. to have a cultural showcase for the kids with learning attached across the school

• ChemCorp for Inside23 at the March 12 Board meeting

- Darcie, students, and myself will be presenting out about ChemCorp to the Board of Education and Sr. Staff. Darcie's (and our school's work) has been added to the OECD Schools+ website (public soon) as an "inspiring global practice" around innovative education
- O GESS will be well represented that night and it's important that our PAC knows about some of the outstanding work being shared that your kids take part in

Global Student Leadership Summit (Blue Mountain, Ontario)

- O Kathy, our Leadership teacher, is partnering with other SD23 high schools to take a few students (6 I think?) to the GSLS in late April
- O The four major areas of focus for the kids include mental health and wellness, environmental leadership, and school and community leadership.
- It's exciting to have GESS students attend this great opportunity at the national level

Provincial Learning Surveys

- Used to be called "Satisfaction surveys"
- o Links and info have been sent home and we encouraged parents/guardians to fill their out. Uptake is usually pretty low (in general) and we would love it if the PAC can do theirs and encourage their GESS friends to do it too. I get a report with the data when it's done, and seeing 15 parent responses total is never a good representative sample.

• Admin Timelines: Timetable Season is Upon Us

- O We're in the throes of it. It's about to be our busiest time of year. Jen is our timetabler and she's learning the process without Darryl to train her. It will all be good, but it will be quite the stretch for us.
 - Course selection presentations were completed with parents and the students
 - Course selection is open until early March and we are working on getting student selection done up
 - Once our numbers are in we have to have a semi-functional timetable before our staffing meeting on April 15th (this month-long step takes 80+ hrs)
 - We find out what our staffing will be. It's the highest stress meeting we
 have all year because this directly means class sizes, what we can offer,
 and who we can hire.
 - Postings open up on May 1st when we start a month of interviewing, hiring, etc. for continuing teachers
 - Temp teachers get hired once we hit July
