#### • Thank you!

O Thanks from all of us for being involved in PAC, our school, and in your child's education. We are so very appreciative of parents/guardians who volunteer and make a difference.

## • Chainsaw Carving Condition (and challenges associated)

- o I received the update from Operations
  - The chainsaw carving from the foyer has rotted through it's core, and it's not possible to save/reuse
  - Also, Operations (due to emergent issues, personnel, etc.) have put a hold on all "school enhancement projects" for the foreseeable future. Some PACs have had projects sitting in limbo for years as it is.
- Joint use and the District of Lake Country
  - With our Joint Use Agreement, the foyer is designated as a shared space. Any future enhancement plans dealing with shared spaces would have a whole other approval process with the DLC
  - History of the sign outside

#### • Visitors from Switzerland and Liechtenstein

- Educators from Europe came to learn in our district and visit schools, ours being one.
   Dr. Frank Brückel from the University of Zurich had a team of 23 teachers, principals, and district leaders here looking at inclusion and pedagogy
  - I've hosted Frank twice in the past, and met him through the TELP program at UBC in Vancouver
- O Visited four of our classrooms, heard from students, and had a chance to speak with teachers. They were blown away by the work our students and teachers are doing.

## • Take Our Kids to Work Day (Gr 9s)

 It's a national day (Wednesday, November 6<sup>th</sup>) where all Grade 9s, if at all possible, spend a day in a worksite. Usually it parents/guardians, but could be aunts, uncles, or trusted neighbours etc. Info will be sent home soon by our Careers team.

## • Government Election CPR Mandate Update

- O Did you know that alongside the cellphone/personal device restrictions, the government also said that all students would learn CPR before graduation? Neither did we.
- All joking aside, we were so busy with startup and the personal devices work that this wasn't looked at until now

- We are meeting with the Lake Country Fire Department they've expressed a desire to support our work with this. We meet next week to chat about options, and we're hopeful we can do this alongside their support.
  - If not, we don't have the equipment to do this in house, and the equipment is expensive.
- We are looking at what grade/class this makes the most sense for, and we're leaning toward Careers 10 – more info to come

## • Remembrance Day

- We have a dedicated committee of staff who are collaborating to make Remembrance
  Day outstanding as always. We are working with HMS as well. This year, rather than try
  and do two ceremonies at once (as is the usual), we have agreed to stagger our
  Remembrance Day assemblies so both bands and choirs can perform at each
  - What this means: HMS will go in the morning, and GESS will do ours in the afternoon. We are happy to shift back and forth each year, moving forward.
