O Thanks from all of us for being involved in PAC, our school, and in your child's education. We are so very appreciative of parents/guardians who volunteer and make a difference.

• Japan (visit to Kun-ei Girls School)

- O I was in Japan the last week representing the school district in Kun-ei's Entrance Ceremony (their start of the school year where they welcome the new students)
- We have Kun-ei students each year in the school district, including two wonderful Japanese students here this year
- o (Jet lag is a real thing...)

VP Update

- O Colin Mayer has been in the VP seat at GESS for the last two weeks. He's the VP in charge of last names starting with A-K, just as Darryl did
- O He's a really kind guy, a self-proclaimed Science geek, and has fit in incredibly well

• Timetabling/Staffing

- O We're in the thick of it. We're making great progress and things are nearing the end product. Timetables take between 80-100 hours to make, and we're almost there. VP Jen Hall has taken the lead and has done very well with her first run through.
- We have our staffing meeting tomorrow afternoon. It's a high-stake meeting and we are hoping that all goes well.
 - It's where the district lets us know how many teachers we are given to run the school. We should be okay in the process knowing there is a deficit looming and we needed to timetable tightly.

• AP Seminar National Youth Leadership and Social Entrepreneurship Event (Ottawa)

- O Two of our Grade 12 students represented our school (Annika and Dani) in Ottawa during the second week of Spring Break at a national leadership conference
- Students collaborated with youth leaders around the country, made TED Talks, and shared their Lake Country perspective with students, teachers, and NGO leaders from across the country.

Windscapes Festival (this week)

 It's year 2 of Windscapes! We parted ways with Kiwanis and decided to run our own music festival

- Goals were to provide a rich experience for kids from around the province while paying adjudicators fairly for their time. In year one we had over 30 schools sign up, and this year we have 38.
- Dave McGarry has been the lead on this project and has done and exceptional job developing and running a unique, powerful Music experience for our students and many, many others.

• Elections Canada

- O I drove into school today to find three party signs on our property. I spent over an hour trying to get hold of the candidates to have the signs removed. One (the Liberal sign) has been taken off property. No response from the NDP and the Greens yet.
- Our school has been chosen to be a polling station on April 28th. It will be a pretty disruptive thing to have in the school during a school day, but with the help from Elections Canada and student volunteers we hope it will as painless as possible.

School Dance (April 22nd)

- Some students (with teacher support) in AP Seminar are planning a Spring dance for grades 9-12 on April 22nd as their "Do Good" project. They've sold around 60 tickets so far. They're hoping for 150ish kids to make it a decent number, but we'll enjoy whoever we get.
- O Students have asked for a dance for all grades, so we'll see what kind of uptake there is. Tickets are on sale in the foyer every day at lunch.

• The Howler Returns

- O A group of students in their AP Seminary "Do Good" project have resurrected The Howler! For those who may not know, it is a student-led news program (essentially) with fun and games, school spirit, etc. all with the goal of providing the students a voice.
 - The team is amazing, and they've produced professional looking material
 - The goal is to create a structure with Grade 11s to build capacity so it continues.
